A Church on Fire

Dear Faith Chapel Family,

I'm still undone by what God is doing in our house. The spirit of the living God is not only stirring-he's transforming. We are in a move of God that is not business as usual. This is not hype, it's an authentic move of God! Just this past week, during our midweek encounter, hundreds gathered in hunger and expectation. And wow... God met us. From the beginning opening worship to the final moment at the altar, his presence was weighty, real, and refreshing. The alter call lasted hours beyond the end of service-hours! People lingered, wept, worshipped, and were ministered to deeply by the spirit of God. And now, dozens have already shared testimonies of freedom, healing, God encounters, and the overwhelming love of Jesus that marked them in our sanctuary. And it didn't stop there... This all happened right smack in the middle of an incredible week. Flash Back

"Be You Not as a Horse"

Excerpt from an article by Alice Sutorous in the May 1977 Faith Builder

"A horse is a willful critter. With each command from the rider, he chooses either to obey the guiding hand on the reins, or, as often happened to me, to take the rider where he was determined to go. Don't we do this to our Lord when we refuse to follow his guiding touch?"

I will instruct thee and teach thee in the way which you should go: I will guide thee with my eyes.

Be not as the horse, or as the mule, which have no understanding: whose mouth must be held in with bit and bridle, lest they come near unto thee.

Many sorrows shall be to the wicked, but he that trusteth in the Lord, mercy shall compass him about.

Psalm 32:8-10

The bit in the horse's mouth controls the direction he goes. This information is included for city-dwellers who have never had to wrestle with a 2000-pound horse to determine who was commanding the situation.) ... As I pray: Lord let me be as yielded to your commands as the most obedient horse. I recall the Lipizzaner horses from Austria. The most famous performing horses, Lipizzaners are known for their obedience to imperceptible commands of their masters. The horses respond to knee pressure, slight shifts in body movement by the rider, and many other subtle signals. Watching them perform, one sees horse and rider in perfect oneness, the horse flowing in response to the rider's slightest direction. My prayer is now that Jesus develops in me a perfect oneness with him, so that I will respond with great sensitivity to his direction."

Declaration of Independence

During the American Revolution, the legal separation of the 13 colonies from Great Britain in 1776 actually occurred on July 2nd, when the second Continental Congress voted to approve a resolution of independence that had been proposed in June by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia declaring the United States independent from great britain's rule. After voting for independence, Congress turned its attention to the Declaration of Independence, a statement explaining this decision, which had been prepared by the committee of five, which asked Thomas Jefferson to author its first draft. While Jefferson consulted extensively with the other board members of the committee of five, he largely wrote the Declaration of Independence in isolation over 17 days between June 11, 1776, and June 28, 1776, from the 2nd floor he was renting in a three story private home at 700 market St. in Philadelphia, now known as the declaration house, and within walking distance of Independence Hall. Congress debated and revised the wording of the declaration, removing Jefferson's vigorous denunciation of King George the third for importing the slave trade, finally approving it two days later on July 4th. A day earlier, John Adams wrote to his wife Abigail: "The second day of July 1776 will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. *It* ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God almighty. It ought to be solemnized with pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations, from one end of this continent to the other from this time forward forevermore." Adam's prediction was off by two days from the outset Americans celebrated independence on July 4th, the date shown on the much-publicized Declaration of Independence, rather than on July 2nd, the date the resolution of independence was approved in a closed session of Congress. Historians have long disputed whether members of Congress signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4th, even though Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, and Benjamin Franklin all later wrote that they had signed it on that day. Most historians have concluded that the declaration was signed nearly a month after its adoption, on August 2nd, 1776, and not on July 4th as is commonly believed. By remarkable coincidence, Thomas Jefferson and John Adams, the only two signatures of the Declaration of Independence later to serve as president of the United states, both died on the same day: July 4th, 1826, which was the 50th anniversary of the declaration. Although not a signatory of the Declaration of Independence, James Monroe, another founding father who was elected president, also died on July 4th, 1831, making him the third president who died on the anniversary of independence. The only U.S. President to have been born on Independence Day was Calvin Coolidge, who was born on July 4th, 1872.
