Dear Faith Chapel Family,

We want our hearts ready, our spirits sensitive, and our lives surrendered. Because what God has planned next will require a people who are prepared, not distracted, nor shallow, but deeply formed in Him. This goes for me too. God give me strength. Faith Chapel, I believe the Lord is calling us deeper and closer. He's inviting us to ride the wind with Him in a way that transforms us before it transforms the world around us. And from that place of depth, He will expand our reach in ways only He can orchestrate. So, let's step into 2026 with faith, expectation, and holy resolve. Let's stay hungry. Let's stay humble. Intentional 21

We're inviting the whole church to join us on a 21 day fast from January 4th-25th. God is doing some remarkable things within our church, and this is not a moment to slow down. We must stay engaged with what the Spirit of God is doing in our midst and follow Him closely. Fasting is a powerful tool. The benefits of that tool are enormous when used properly. Setting aside seasons of time to fast and pray (WHICH SHOULD ALWAYS GO HAND IN HAND), deny the flesh and invests in the spirit. It's a time of rearranging. It's a time of rearranging priorities and ensuring the focus of your heart is on God and not on peripheral things. Be intentional with your time and with the Lord during this season even if there's no change in what you eat. Bottom line, do what you feel the Holy Spirit is leading you to do. Just provoke and challenge yourself to remain engaged with Him with great intentionality during the season. An email will be sent out daily with a "Daily Engagement" created by staff and leaders within the church during this time. It will act as an encouragement and guide for you each day. We want to equip you to engage with God with tools we've found helpful in our own pursuits with the Lord.

The Twelve Disciples

Bartholomew

Also called Nathaniel, his occupation is unknown. He was honest and straight forward. He initially rejected Jesus because Jesus was from Nazareth, but he acknowledged him as the “Son of God” and the “King of Israael” when they met. Jesus called Bartholomew an “Israelite in whom there is no deceit.” A key lesson from his life is that Jesus respects honesty in people—even if they challenge him because of it. Tradition holds that Bartholomew undertook missionary journeys to various regions, including India, and Armenia, where he is said to have preached the Gospel and established Christian communities. As one of Jesus’ disciples, Bartholomew witnessed His ministry and teachings firsthand. Although he is not mentioned extensively in the New Testament, he is

recognized as a significant figure in the early Christian church. After Jesus’ resurrection and ascension, Bartholomew, along with the other apostles, played a crucial role in spreading Christianity. His martyrdom is often depicted in art, with accounts suggesting he was flayed alive. His role as an apostle and missionary highlights the importance of the early disciples in the establishment of Christianity, and he is remembered for his dedication to spreading the teachings of Jesus. In summary, Bartholomew the disciple, is a pivotal figure in Christian history, known for his commitment to the faith and missionary efforts.
