Pastor's Perspective

Dear Faith Chapel Family,

We are living in a move of God! This house is not just a gathering place—it's an atmosphere saturated with the Spirit of the Living God. Week after week, we see lives radically changed, hearts set free, and people stepping into the fullness of their calling. We are not just creating a space where God is present—we are building a culture where His Spirit dominates. When the Spirit of God moves, He doesn't just push back darkness—He transforms it. This is the kind of atmosphere God is cultivating in our midst—one of complete transformation! In 1 Samuel 19, King Saul set out to capture David, sending men to take him down. But something incredible happened. Every time his men approached, the Spirit of God overwhelmed them, and they began to prophesy. Again and again, it happened. Finally, Saul himself came to stop David, but the Spirit of God apprehended him: "Then the Spirit of God came even upon Saul, and he too began to prophesy... He tore off his clothes and lay naked on the ground all day and all night, prophesying in the presence of Samuel. The people who were watching exclaimed, 'What? Is

even Saul a prophet?" (1 Samuel 19:23-24) What was meant for harm was turned into an encounter with God. That's what happens in a Spirit-dominated culture—people are not just repelled by His presence; they are transformed by it! Faith Chapel, this is what God is doing here! We are not here just to defend against darkness, we are here to see lives transformed by the glory of His presence! When people step into this house, whether they come broken, skeptical, or even opposed to the things of God, our prayer is that they would be overwhelmed by His Spirit and leave forever changed. This is already happening. Praise God! So, what does this mean for us? It means we worship with full surrender because the Spirit of God moves in an atmosphere of hunger. It means we pray without ceasing because transformation happens in the presence of God. It means we love without hesitation, believing that no one is beyond His reach. We are not here to play church—we are here to cultivate a Kingdom culture where the Spirit reigns, where even those opposed to a move of God can become family through a newfound humility and surrender. Where Saul becomes a prophet, and where transformation is inevitable! We're culturing like Christ, let's not settle

for anything less than a move of God that changes everything. This is our moment. This is our calling. This is our mandate-a culture of transformation that looks just like Jesus.

Good Friday

If Good Friday is such a solemn occasion, then why do we refer to it as "good"? Although there was technically nothing good about the day Jesus suffered and died for us, the outcome certainly is! It was the day Jesus became the perfect, sacrificial Lamb who shed His blood for the remission of our sins (<u>Romans 5:8; 6:23; 1 Peter 3:18</u>). This was the greatest act of love known to man—God the Father sent His Son, Jesus, to die in our place. And because of Jesus' Sunday morning resurrection, those who place their trust in Him believe in a living Savior who will one day return to claim His own (John 14:1–3).

Easter Sunday

Easter Sunday is held the first Sunday after the first full moon following the Vernal Equinox, which puts it between March 22 and April 25. The original method of observing Easter Sunday is unknown. In its purest form, Easter is celebrated in the spring—near the time of the Passover, which is near the time of Christ's crucifixion. It is held on a Sunday, which is the day of the week on which Jesus rose (Matthew 28:1). And it is a time for all of corporate Christianity to celebrate Christ's resurrection and our freedom from sin. None of this is demanded or even suggested in the Bible, but it is not wrong for the church to choose one day a year to intentionally acknowledge Jesus' triumph over death.
